SUBJECT: CITY COUNCIL REORGANIZATION

RECOMMENDATION

In accordance with the City Council Handbook and Atherton Municipal Code, select the Mayor and Vice Mayor for calendar year 2022.

BACKGROUND | ANALYSIS

City Council adopted Ordinance No. 528 in November 2001, amending Atherton Municipal Code Section 2.04.030 related to the appointment of the Mayor and Vice Mayor. Ordinance No. 528 states, "The city council shall meet at least annually to choose one of its members as Mayor and one of its members as Vice Mayor." Section 2.04.040 further provides that the term of office of the mayor and vice mayor shall be one year. No member shall serve as mayor or vice mayor for consecutive terms.

Nomination Process – Selection of Mayor & Vice Mayor

The City Clerk shall declare the office of Mayor vacant and ask for nominations for the position of Mayor. Any Council Member may nominate someone other than herself or himself for the position. Nominations do not require a second.

When it appears that no further nominations will be made, the City Clerk shall announce that the nominations are closed. If only one Council member has been nominated, the City Clerk shall call for a vote on the nomination. The nominated Council Member must receive three affirmative votes to be selected as Mayor.

If more than one Council Member has been nominated, the City Clerk shall call for a vote of the first person nominated. If that candidate receives three or more votes, the City Clerk shall declare that candidate selected as Mayor and the voting concludes. If not, the City Clerk shall call for a vote for the second candidate in the same manner. The candidate receiving three or more votes shall be declared the Mayor.

Led by the new Mayor or the City Clerk, the process repeats for the selection of Vice Mayor from the remaining four members of the City Council. The Vice Mayor role is currently vacant.
